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STATE RELEASES MODIFIED CCRPI DATA

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(MACON, GA) – On Wednesday, November 16, the Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE) released a modified version of its College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI). This is the first time CCRPI data has been released since before the COVID-19 pandemic. As such, there is no comprehensive scale score, in addition to other factors being unavailable.

Several Bibb County schools performed better than the state average in content mastery, which measures student achievement on the Georgia Milestones and similar assessments. This included Alexander II Math & Science Magnet School, Sonny Carter Elementary School, Skyview Elementary School and Springdale Elementary School, which all performed above the state average of 63 percent on content mastery. Alexander II led the way in that regard at 90.03 percent.

“As we recover, restore and rebuild post-pandemic, participation in the Georgia Milestones continues to increase,” said Dara Foy, Director of Research, Evaluation, Assessment and Accountability. “Eight elementary schools reported 100 percent participation and all grades three through eight had an average participation score of 95 percent or better.”

Those same four schools, joined by Vineville Academy of the Arts and Miller Fine Arts Magnet Middle School, also exceeded the state average of 71.80 percent in readiness, which measures student preparedness to proceed to the next grade level. Alexander II again led the District in that metric with a score of 83.80 percent.

“The Bibb County School District recognizes the ongoing accomplishments of our staff, students, and community as it embraces the opportunity to promote college and career readiness for our students,” Foy said.

Vision: Each student will demonstrate strength of character and will be college or career ready.

Mission: The Bibb County School District develops a highly trained staff and an engaged community dedicated to educating each student for a 21st century global society.

As part of the release, three of the District's high schools were noted as being above the state average in combined four- and five-year graduation rate. This is a different metric than the four-year rate previously announced this school year. The state average was 84.70 percent, followed closely by a Bibb average of 81.10 percent. Central High School notched an 88.90 percent average graduation rate, with VIP Academy coming in at 88.40 percent and Howard High School coming in at 85 percent.
